<p>The goal of this program is to provide outreach, shelter and support services to runaway, homeless, and at-risk street youth in order to convince and assist RHY to use available community services to leave the street for a safer and more productive life.</p>	<p>There is a need for street outreach to RHY in Monroe.</p> <p>By building trusting relationships with RHY through street outreach, ongoing contact and provision of services it is possible to assist street youth to exit street life by reunifying with family or establishing alternative living arrangements.</p> <p>Providing survival aid supplies and access to a drop-in center will enable youth to live healthier, safer lives.</p>	<p>Funding Sources: -SOP Grant -Fundraising -Donations(monetary and in-kind)</p> <p>Drop-in-Center</p> <p>Project Staff: -1 FT Outreach Coordinator -3 PT Street Outreach Workers</p> <p>Volunteers</p> <p>RHY Street Ambassadors</p> <p>Community Partnerships: -MCSO, KWPD, DJJ, DCF, SHAL, MCSD- CHIPS, Kids Come First, Unity</p> <p>Service Linkages: KOTS, FKCS-Jelsema Shelter, St. Mary's Star of the Sea, Florida Council Against Sexual Violence</p> <p>Survival Aid Supplies: -hygiene kits -first aid -food/drink -clothes/socks/shoes</p> <p>2,000 informational pamphlets and educational materials</p>	<p>Street Outreach in teams of 2 daily in KW, weekly late night in LK, and monthly through MK and UK</p> <p>Drop-in Center operation offering extensive support services</p> <p>Individual strengths and needs assessments</p> <p>Survival Aid Supplies</p> <p>Prevention and general education re: at-risk behaviors/issues, health and safety, etc.</p> <p>Case planning re: alternative living arrangements, 24- hour direct referral access to shelter including transportation, and family reunification services</p> <p>Follow-up support services</p> <p>Crisis counseling, trauma intervention services, group therapy/ counseling, life-skills training and direct referral to mental health treatment and counseling services</p> <p>First aid, on-call doctor, direct referral to medical services</p> <p>Substance abuse education/information and direct referral to substance abuse counseling and detoxification services</p> <p>Identification/employment/ education services</p> <p>Presentations to community agencies, businesses, and individuals</p> <p>Positive Youth Development activities</p> <p>Pre-training, in-service training, and on-site supervision</p>	<p>In 36 months of program operation:</p> <p>-600 RHY will be contacted</p> <p>-500 RHY will receive survival aid supplies/educational information</p> <p>-500 RHY will access further resources at the drop-in center</p> <p>-300 RHY will have at least 5 visits and thus receive ongoing case planning/management</p> <p>-Individual and family assessment data will be collected from 300 RHY</p>	<p>In 36 months of program operation:</p> <p>-75 RHY will access temporary emergency shelter</p> <p>-45 RHY will achieve a safe exit through reunification with family or in an safe, healthy alternative living arrangement</p> <p>-100 RHY will receive mental health care</p> <p>-100 RHY will receive medical care</p> <p>-50 RHY will receive substance abuse services</p> <p>-75 RHY will obtain identification</p> <p>-50 RHY will receive job services/achieve employment</p> <p>-15 RHY will receive their GED or enroll in school</p>
